Footnotes

Response scales to the survey questions varied by question, as follows:

- For questions 1 through 11, responses were collected using a standard, seven-point rating scale, where a response of 5 or higher was considered a positive response.
- For questions 12 and 13, response choices included 'Yes', 'No', 'I don't know' or 'I don't remember'
- For question 14, responses were collected using a five-point rating scale, where a response of 4 or higher indicated being satisfied or very satisfied with the HMG program.

Response Rate Calculation Method

Questionnaires were distributed to families who were determined eligible for the Help Me Grow Early Intervention program on or before December 1, 2011, and still enrolled in the program when the questionnaire was distributed in October 2012. The Ohio Department of Health received 1189 surveys, for a statewide response rate of 27.0%.
