Updates/changes were made to ET 3.0 on 17 August. When updates/changes occur, a memo is sent to county HMG Project Directors and ET System Administrators. *Please notify all of your county ET users that this memo can be accessed under "ET Info" in Early Track.*

Summary of Updates and Changes

Early Track Report Changes

Many of the Early Track reports are now based on data stored in a reporting database, rather than the live database that users are updating throughout the day. Eventually, all Early Track reports will query data in the reporting database. We are making this change in order to create a more stable environment for Early Track. By using the reporting database, users are less likely to encounter Early Track system errors when entering and saving data. However, in order to gain this greater stability, Early Track reports from the reporting database will be somewhat less current than reports that query the live database. The reporting database will be updated Sunday through Thursday evenings at 10:00pm. Thus, reports that are run during the work week may be based on data that were entered as much 24 hours in the past. To aid users, a message will now appear in the footer of reports that states how current the data used to create the report are. Although users may be somewhat inconvenienced by the slightly less current data used to create these reports, the benefits of a more stable Early Track system environment more than outweigh these costs.

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All Early Track reports are not yet based on data in the reporting database. Any report querying the reporting database is run using a “Get Report DB” button. Reports querying the live database are run using a “Get Report” button.
