

Public Reporting of Part C Data

Indicator 8a – Percent of all Part C children exiting Help Me Grow who received timely transition planning to support the child’s transition to preschool and other appropriate community services by their third birthday including IFSPs with transition steps and services.

This indicator was not reported in Ohio’s 07/01/05 – 06/30/06 APR because it was included in the state’s Compliance Agreement with OSEP.

Indicator 8b – Percent of all Part C children exiting Help Me Grow who received timely transition planning to support the child’s transition to preschool and other appropriate community services by their third birthday including notification to school district if a child is potentially eligible for preschool special education.

Data was not collected for this county regarding this indicator in the current year.

Indicator 8c – Percent of all Part C children exiting Help Me Grow who received timely transition planning to support the child’s transition to preschool and other appropriate community services by their third birthday including a transition conference at least 90 days before age 3, if the child is potentially eligible for preschool special education.
